Child Find is looking for children who are "not exactly the same" as others their age. These youngsters may have difficulty walking, talking, hearing, or learning. Or they may have beheavior problems.

Parents. Grandparents. Doctors. Teachers. Anyone concerned about a youngster who isn't exactly the same as others the same age. How Can Child Find Help?

Many of the youngsters who are referred to Child Find may be entitled to special education and related services. And, the younger the child, the more effective those services will be.

Children who are referred to Child Find will receive free testing to determine if the differences you notice require services or if they are "nothing to worry about."

If the child has a disability and eligible for special education or related services, the public schools will work with the child's parents to design a program just for that
