Harley R. Eichner, a retired American Ridge farmer, died Thursday, December 24, at the Valley Rehabilitation and Living Center at Lewiston of causes related to age. He was 80.

Eichner was born January 11, 1912, at Kendrick to Claus and Bertha Otto Eichner. He attended grade school on American Ridge and graduated from Kendrick High School.

At the age of 16 and upon the death of his father, he took over the family farm, working the land until retiring in 1980.

Eichner married Juanita M. Stanton on November 27, 1930. She died in 1988. He moved to the Regency Plaza in Lewiston in 1990.

He had served as a commissioner of the Kendrick Road District and had been a board member of the American Ridge School District, a director of Kendrick Rochdale and had been a committee member of the Latah Soil Conservation District.

Survivors include two sons, Harley G. Eichner of Tucson, Ariz., and Donald H. (Bud) Eichner of Kendrick; two sisters, Lula Simpson of Lewiston and Maud Hunter of Moscow; 7 grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren, 3 step-grandchildren and several stepgreat-grandchildren. Two brothers, a sister and a grandson died before him.

The funeral service was held Wednesday at 2 p. m. at Kendrick's American Ridge Cemetery with the Rev. Susan Butts of the Kendrick United Methodist Church officiating.



Under Section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended

3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion;
4. The location on a map and the number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be provided as replacement dwelling units. If such data are not available at the time of the general submission, the City of Kendrick will identify the general location of an area map and the approximate number of dwelling units by size and pro-

The City Clerk, 289-5157, is responsible for ensuring requirements are met for notification and provision of relocation assistance, as described in CFR570.606(b) through (g), to any lower-income person displaced by the demolition of any dwelling unit or the conversion of a low/moderate income dwelling unit to another use in connection with an assisted activity.

Consistent with the goals and objectives of activities assisted under the Act, the City of Kendrick will take the following steps to minimize the displacement of persons from their homes:

- 1. Coordinate code enforcement with rehabilitation and housing assistance programs.
2. Evaluate housing codes and rehabilitation standards in reinvestment areas to prevent their placing undue financial burden on long-established owners or tenants of multi-family buildings.
3. Stage rehabilitation of apartment units to allow tenants to remain during and after rehabilitation by working with empty units or buildings first.
4. Establish facilities to house persons who must be relocated temporarily during rehabilitation.
5. Adopt public policies to identify and mitigate displacement resulting from intensive public investment in neighborhoods.
6. Adopt policies which provide reasonable protections for tenants faced with conversion to a condominium or cooperative.
7. Adopt tax assessment policies such as deferred tax payment plans to reduce impact of rapidly increasing assessments on lower-income owner-occupants or tenants in revitalizing areas.
8. Establish counseling centers to provide homeowners and renters with information on the assistance available to help them remain in their neighborhood in the face of revitalization pressures. (The jurisdiction should include one or more of the above to implement the planning for minimizing the direct and indirect displacement of persons from their homes.
