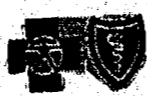

Beware of Give-Away Promotions, Warns State

Boise— "(Y)ou are among millions certified as a first round cash winner . . ." So reads a promotion sent to Idahoans by a New York business.

Raffoler Ltd. uses the prize promotion to get Idahoans to purchase watches for \$35. No purchase is necessary, but consumers are told in fine print that in order to claim their prize, they must do so in writing.

Attorney General Larry Echohawk's Consumer Protection Unit contacted Raffoler Ltd. to find out what first round winners could expect to get. "They told us that each 1st round prize winner will receive the grand sum at at least 36 cents. Assuming you opt not to buy the watch, participants will find themselves ahead about seven cents after postage," Echohawk said.

"To many people learn too late that most prize promotions are not
