

• Recutting the end stems under warm water.
• Changing the base water every day.
• Using a floral preservative
If the rose wilts, you can submerge the entire rose and stem in warm (100 F) water and straighten the stem. Cut an inch from end of stem under waer. Allow to stay for about 20 minutes before treating and putting back in vase.
There is no guarantee on how long a rose will last.
