**Elora Lightle Beauchamp,
Daughter of Lenore
Pioneers, Passed Mar. 2**

Elora Lightle Beauchamp, the last survivor of a Lenore pioneer family died March 2, 1993 in California at the age of 100 years.

She was the first born daughter of Galen and Rosamond Vaughan Lightle She was born Dec. 27, 1892 in Bogard, Missouri. The family moved to Lenore, Idaho when she was 6 months old. Three of the other Lightle children were born there: Frances, Stillman and Olive who are buried in the family plot there.

After the father's passing, the family moved to Long Beach, Calif. in 1906.

She and her husband, Leslie Beauchamp and their children moved to Temple City, Calif. in 1929 where was a prominent real estate and insurance man in both Arcadia and Temple City.

Mrs. Beauchamp had been a member of the Temple City Woman's Club for over 50 years and was very active in flower arranging groups and an active member of the LA County Arboretum in Arcadia.

At the time of her death she had been a resident at Big Pine Care Center for four years. She had celebrated her 100th birthday the end of December. Before coming to the Owens Valley she had lived with her daughter and son-in-law, Mary and Paul Mundy in Arcadia for three

BARLEY BEARDS . . .

Poultry and livestock demand in the world food chain has reason to give barley and corn growers optimism for the rest of the century, according to Gary McKinney, U. S. Feed Grain specialist in Egypt.

The cycle from subsidized broiler production to private operations is a classic example in Egypt, McKinney explained.

"Through the 1960s and 1970s poultry consumption increased steadily in Egypt with the help of government subsidies. Everything was supported from buildings to feed. In 1984, the government stopped subsidies and producers went broke," he said.

"In 1986 private farmers and capital reclaimed the buildings and production has grown until the need now has created a major market," McKinney concluded.

Department of Agriculture statistics show U. S. exports of livestock products has grown better than 25% since 1985.

The department credits rising incomes in developing countries along with population growth with the demand for more meat.

"The demand for barley, corn, and soybeans for livestock feed will give U. S. feed grain farmers a good shot at this market," McKinney said.

The Ag department put demand for feed grains at more than 500 million bushel for U. S. exports in 1993.

The Philippines, Taiwan, Mexico, Egypt and Brazil have been the leading nations in increased meat imports the past ten years according to the department.

Domestic demand for poultry has also grown rapidly. It will take nine million tons of barley and corn for 1993 production, the Ag department says, and more than 17 million tons of corn will be needed for ethanol and fuel production over the next ten years.
