Winter Creates Need For Speed and Load Limits on Highways

BOISE — Winter cold and the warmth of spring have created the need to place speed and load limits on Idaho's highway system, a spokesman for the Idaho transportation Department reports.

Speed and load limits are placed annually on Idaho's highways to protect the road surface from extensive breakup Clayton Sullivan, maintenance engineer for the department said.

"Cold weather combined with moisture and a warm spring make the roads susceptible to breakup," Sullivan said. "Without these limits, there would be hundreds of thousands of dollars of damage done

yearly to the roads." When the ground thaws and refreezes, it creates unstable soil conditions upon which the road surface rests. Fast moving and heavy-loaded vehicles can force the shifting of the soil and cause the road surface to shift or break. Above-normal amounts of rainfall compound the problem.

Speed reductions are first imposed to protect the surface. If speed reductions are not adequate, then the transportation department restricts the weight of the vehicles traveling the road.

Carriers are alerted to the limits by the department's permit and district offices and the state's port of entries. Each restricted road is posted with highway signs stating the load limits.

"The department works with the

transportation industry in establishing the most reasonable restrictions possible to maintain the roads and serve commerce," Sullivan said.
