

Pre-Construction Meet Tuesday Afternoon

A pre-contsruction meeting concerning Kendrick's new fire station was held Tuesday afternoon at the city hall. Present were representatives of the Volunteer Fire Dept., the city council, the architect, contractor and two sub-contractors and Rebecca Williams, the CEDA representative for this area.

The meeting was to up-date all the various groups and individuals who are involved in the construction and planning of the fire station, Mrs. Williams reviewed the rules, regulations and requirements of the construction, wihch are many as some of the costs are being paid by federal and state grant monies.

The group learned that construction is scheduled to begin about the middle of August and a completion date before the end of the year is expected to be met.

Cost of the new building which will also house the ambulance and emergency services vehicle, is estimated at \$191,000. A grant of \$124, 000 will meet some of the expenses but the remainder must come from matching funds. The sale of the old building will meet some of the cost, but donations are still needed, fire chief Rick McGregor said Tuesday. Anyone wishing to make a don-






