Many Beautiful Porch Decorations Made Judges' Work Difficult This Season

Cross and Star are Becoming Traditions in Juliaetta Area

(Note: For many years now a lighted cross at Easter season and star at the Christmas holidays have been part of Juliaetta's special appeal and attractiveness. For those who do not know by whom they were created, Nell Heimgartner has submitted this brief history.)

The first Christmas Cross to adorn the Juliaetta Valley was a small one that was hung on the TV antenna by a group of Juliaetta men—Jim Farrington, Darrell Manfull, Jim Muscat, and Ted Groseclose. Clair Reed also assisted in installing the lights with the WWP ladder truck. This was left on during the Christmas season but had to be removed immediately following at the request of the TV company.

Dick and Ted Groseclose put up a cross that fall in a different location. They built this one with arms that would swing down to simply the changing of light bulbs. This structure blew down in two weeks. This was about twenty-five years ago.

That fall Dick and Ted Groseclose and Ray and Lawrence Heimgartner dragged poles in by hand (donated by Otto Schupfer), dug holes, set the poles, and erected a larger and permanent cross which was turned on that Christmas. The cross was enjoyed at Christmas and Easter for many years by Juliaetta residents and the rest of the surrounding area as well as others that were just passing through.

The Star

Sixteen years ago, Dick Groseclose planned out a way to hang a star on the same frame as the cross. He built it in his yard, then hauled it up to the cross and mounted it so everyone could enjoy the Star at Christmas time and the Cross at Easter. This was placed on land belonging to Walter Zumhove.

Five years ago, wind blew down the creation again. This time, Dick, Janice and Marilou Groseclose took new poles and lumber, dug new holes, replaced the poles, and rebuilt the whole structure—both the Star and the Cross.

Dick Groseclose has maintained this through all the years. Dick walks back in—sometimes in deep mud and sometimes in deep snow—to do maintenance and to turn the cross and the star on and off. He climbs up on the 32-foot structure to replace the bulbs when necessary.

This is Dick's special Christmas and Easter greeting to his family and the entire community—year after year.

ORDINANCE NO. 647

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KENDRICK, IDAHO, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 630, PROVIDING FEES FOR THE ISSUANCE OF LICENSES FOR THE SALE OF BEER, WINE AND ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR BY THE CITY, PROVIDING THAT ALL REMAINING PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 630 SHALL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION ACCORDING TO LAW.

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it in the public interest to regulate the sale of beer, wine, and alcoholic liquor within the City; NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KENDRICK AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That Section 4 of Ordinance No. 630, and the same hereby is, repealed and a new Section 4 enacted to read as follows:

LICENSE FEES: Every person licensed under the provisions of this Ordinance shall pay the City an annual license fee, for each location, as established or amended by Ordinance or Resolution of the Council. Categories of licenses and fees therefore shall include:

LICENSE	SEE
(1) For consumption of beer on premises	\$ 75
(2) For sale of beer to be consumed off premises	\$ 25
(3) For consumption of wine on premises	\$ 25
(4) For sale of wine to be consumed off premises	\$ 25
(5) For consumption of alcoholic liquors on premises	\$225

Any business or non-profit organization serving less than ninety days during the year shall pay one-half of the above rates.

SECTION 2. All provisions of other ordinances in conflict with provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance will be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

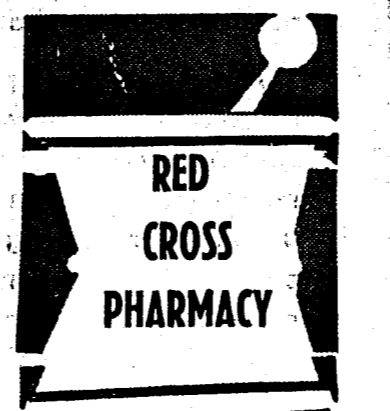

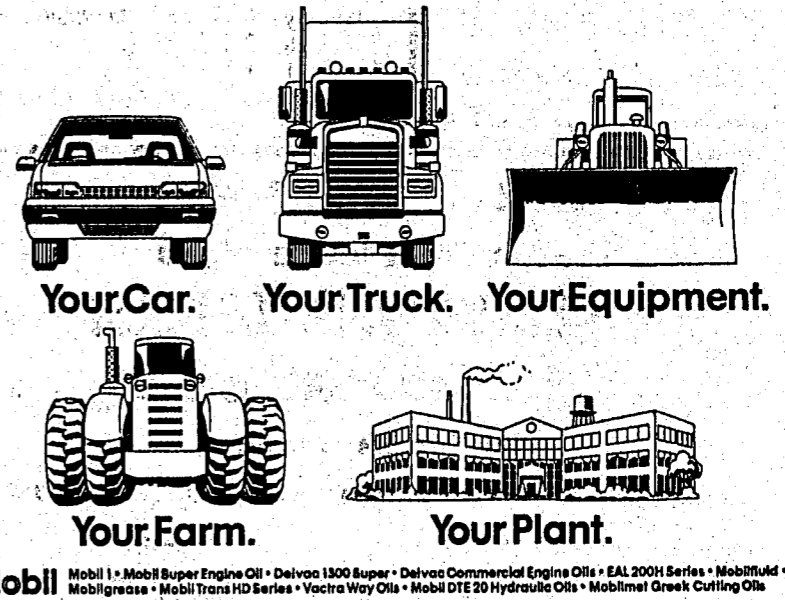
