

Both the Latah County Commissioners and Latah County Sanitation, a private firm, has been aware of the coming crisis and have been negotiating for a long time to find out how the garbage will be collected, where it will be taken, where it will utlimately be put and how much all of this is going to cost. Basically all that has been determined is that the rates are going to increase and the landfill between Troy and Moscow will be closed on March 31. It can only be assumed that the garbage collected in the county will be trucked out to either Oregon or Washington, two states that have been mentioned as being used to receive this county's solid waste.

Also, for Kendrick residents, the \$13.00 charge is for 2 regular-size garbage cans a week. There will be an additional \$1 a week per can if the two-can limit is exceeded.

It is understood that Latah Sanitation is encouraging county resident with large items to be disposed of such as appliances, etc. to get them to the landfill before it is forced to stop accepting waste.
