"JUST THE FACTS"—CHILD SAFETY SEATS

Do children really need to be buckled up around town and on short trips? Believe it or not, it's the short trips at low speeds that lead to the greatest number of crashes. About 75 percent of all crashes occur within 25 miles of home. In addition, about 40 percent of all fatal crashes occur on roads where the posted speed limit is 45 miles per hour or less. Low speed crashes or even a panic stop can cause serious injuries.

Won't a safe driver protect his or her child by avoiding collisions? Good careful drivers usually do not cause crashes, but they are often involved in crashes caused by other not-so-careful drivers, inclement weather or mechanical failure. You just never know. Safety belts and child safety seats can't keep you from having a crash, but they can improve your chances of escaping injury or death.

Besides, in a crash situation, correctly restrained drivers are better able to maintain control. The safety belt will help a driver stay in position behind the steering wheel and retain control of the vehicle.

Legal Notice

SUMMARY OF KENDRICK ORDINANCE NO. 648

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING PRIOR ORDINANCES PERTAINING TO BUILDING CODES AND ADOPTING THE 1991 EDITIONS OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING CODE, THE UNIFORM HOUSING CODE, AND THE UNIFORM CODE FOR THE ABATEMENT OF DANGEROUS BUILDINGS, THE NORTHWEST ENERGY CODE (UBC COMPATIBLE CODE), 1990 AND APPENDICES THERETO, THE NORTHWEST ENERGY CODE CONVERSION EQUIVALENT STANDARDS 1990, AND THE AMERICAN NATIONAL STANDARD SPECIFICATION FOR MAKING BUILDING AND FACILITIES ACCESSIBLE TO AND USABLE BY THE PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED, AND APPENDICES THERETO AS SPECIFIED, APPENDIX B, ADA ACCESSIBILITY GUIDELINES, AND APPENDIX C, UNIFORM ACCESSIBILITY STANDARDS FROM THE ADA HANDBOOK ALL AS THE CITY OF KENDRICK BUILD-CODE; PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENT OF CERTAIN SECTIONS OF SAID CODES PERTAINING TO SCOPE, MIXING AND PLACING CONCRETE, AND FOOTINGS AND FOUNDATIONS; PROVIDING FOR DEFINITION OF TERMS; VOIDING PERMITS CONTRARY TO LAW; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR ENACTMENT.

SECTION 1 provides authority for adoption of building regulations; SECTION 2 repeals prior codes; SECTION 3 provides that at least one copy of each uniform code shall be on file with the City Clerk; SECTION 4 adopts the uniform building codes set forth in the title; SECTION 5 deletes Appendix 53 of the Uniform Building Code; SECTION 7 defines terms; SECTION 8 voids permits issued contrary to other laws; SECTION 9 provides penalties for violations; SECTION 10 provides or severability; SECTION 11 provides an effective date.


