### Park News

#### Charlie Enger Passes—

Charles S. Enger, 86, one of the left of his generation of Parkites, died of age-related causes Wednesday, February 23, at Moscow Care Center. Charlie was born at Park to Peter and Sarah Potter Enger, November 9, 1907. He worked in the woods and for the CCC as a young man. He married Hazel E. Mael on December 7, 1935 at Moscow and they lived briefly at Clarkia and Bovill before returning to Park where he and his family farmed, raised market strawberries, and operated a small sawmill. He drove the Park school bus to Deary from 1954 to 1975. In 1968, they moved to Deary where they made their home. Hazel died in December of 1991 and he entered the care center in November of 1993.

He served on the Deary city council and the cemetery board, he and Hazel having been caretakers of the Park Cemetery for many years. The couple were avid deer and elk hunters and enjoyed fishing, photography, and rock and coin collecting. Survivors include three sons, Karl of Park, Linn of Genesee, and Charles of Wenatchee, Wash.; a daughter, Kathy Doyle of Palouse, Wash.; a sister, Mae Currier of Lewiston; nine grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Three brothers, three sisters, and two grandchildren died previously.

A memorial service was held on

Saturday, March 5, at the Deary Community Church with Pastor Carl Kinne officiating. Pianist was Kathryn Campbell and vocalist was Barbara Kinzer, who sang "Day by Day" and "In the Garden". Ushers were Russ and Tom Foster and Arnold Mael.

A private burial service will be held at the Park Cemetery in the spring.

The family suggests memorials be sent to the Deary Ambulance Fund.

A potluck dinner followed the service at the Deary Fire Hall. Although Charlie had been failing health for several years, and none of us would ask that he suffer longer, he will be long remembered and sorely missed. Our love and prayers go out to his family.
