The book, modest at first, found was capivated by Carla's home-spun. easy-to-read style and the poactical advice she was offering. As the book her book Carla began touring the country, appearing on television,

publications. With the success of her book, Carla out-grew her "living room" that once housed the Country Kitchen, where she installed bigger and better mimeograph machines and bindery equipment, plus an everincreasing staff, mostly local,

But now Carla had a national reputation and those searching for a simpler, easier life, quickly responded. People came from all parts of the nation and Carla had to purchase the old Kendrick Hotel to accomodate an increasing enrollment. All this time Emery was still devoting much to her time and efforts to publicity tours, interviews

and other distractions. One summer day in the mid-seveniies a distastrous rain storm moveed into the area, dumping inches of water and caused a flash flood that washed out the school and many of Carla's dreams. The school slowly receded.

Also, the book had become so popular that it just wasn't possible to produce it and merchandise it on the local level. Carla sold the right to a New York City publisher, who didn't merchandise it well.

Family troubles also began to appear and Carla and Mike were divorced. Carla moved first to Mosand later to the Seattle area. Everything seemed as if it would

disappear. But Carla still had the dream, the ambition and the talent plus one thing that endured—a loyal, readership of those still interested in living in harmony with the land and themselves. To this day, the Gazette receives inquires about Carla and her book from all across the country and even from Alaska. Now the ninth edition of "Carla Emery's Old Fashioned Recipe Book" is ready for distribution. That's what this Saturday is all






