### Fred Silflow **Re-Elected Trustee**

By certificate of election, the board of trustees of Kendrick Joint School District No. 283 took action to declare Fred Silflow, Zone 5 trustee (rural Nez Perce (Leland, Cameron, Southwick and Clearwater Counties) duly elected at Thursday's regular May board meeting, thus cancelling Tuesday, May 17's trustee election.

A relatively new law, 33-502B Idaho Code, makes it permissive for board of trustees to save the election expenses if there is no declared or write-in candidate, to declare the one filed candidate the winner and cancel the election. As of July 1, 1994 the legislature amended this Idaho Code section to make it mandatory that board of trustees cancel an election to save election expense.

Supt. Eldon Taylor indicated that the only problem small school districts such as our have is quick turnaround communication with the votters. Kendrick school district uses the Gazette, a weekly newspaper, as its "newspaper of record", and the deadline date for declared write-in candidates is 5 days before the election. The advertised trustee election was to be Tuesday, May 17, and 5 days previous would make the writein deadline by closing time of the district office hours on Thursday, May 12. Fortunately, both the Lewiston Tribune and the Moscow Daily News have been good about announcing canceled trustee elections. The


