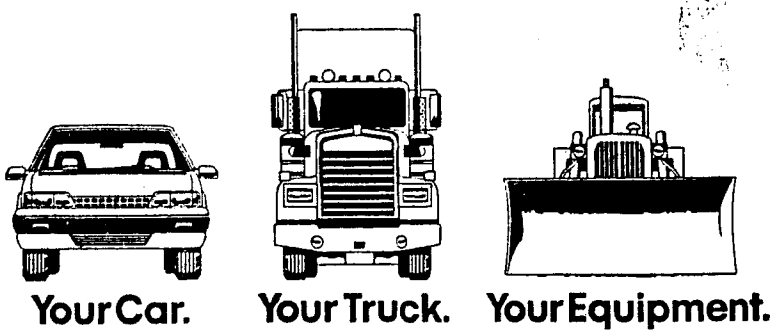

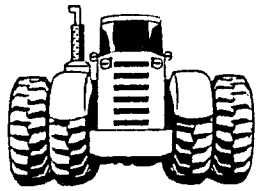

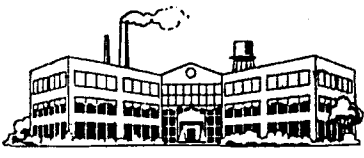

NOTICE OF TAX INCREASE

Kendrick Joint School District No. 283 has proposed to increase its annual budget by an amount of ad valorem tax revenues that exceeds one hundred five percent (105%) of the ad valorem tax revenues certified for its annual budget during the previous year by 15.89% or its ad valorem property tax rate by 17.45%.
