

Drivers under 21 with alcohol concentration levels of 0.02 or higher will lose their licenses in the same

The swift and sure loss of driving privileges has reduced drunk driving and alcohol-related traffic crashes in the 33 states that already have ALS laws in effect. These laws have reduced fatal crashes by about 9 percent during periods when alcohol is used most heavily, such as nighttime and holidays, according to the Insurance Institute for Highway

"The Idaho Transportation Dethe tragic, preventable loss of lives due to drunk drivers," said Marie Bishop, manager of the Office of Highway Safety.

In 1993, automobile crashes killed 230 people in Idaho. Drunk driving accounted for over one-third of the deaths. Alcohol-related accidents cost Idaho an estimated \$73.3 milion last year.

Idaho courts will still handle all criminal aspects of DUI offenses, including license suspension for rerefusal to submit to sobriety testing.


