AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF JULIAETTA, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, PROVIDING THAT REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS BE HELD ON THE SECOND AND FOURTH TUESDAYS OF EACH MONTH AT 7:00 O'CLOCK P. M. PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTER OCTOBER 1, 1994.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council deem it in the public interest to hold their meetings at the time provided herein;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JULIAETTA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the Juliaetta City Council meetings shall be held as follows:

JULIAETTA CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

Regular meetings of the Council shall be held in the Council Chambers on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month at the hour of 7:00 P. M. Regular or special meetings of the Council may be recessed until further notice or until a call by the Mayor. At all meetings of the Council, a majority of the Council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business unless otherwise provided by law. A question before the Council shall be decided by a majority of the members present unless otherwise provided by law.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

That this ordinance shall be in full force from and after October 1, 1994.
