School Architect's **Preliminary Plans Near Completion**

Jim Bellamy, the school architect, met with school officials and members of building needs assessment will be sent to the Idaho State Department of Education for review before October 1.

The funding for this project will be decided in an October 18 bond election. This \$700,000 project should not raise property taxes because the present school bond that built the 1985 Juliaetta Elementary Gymnasdiction last week that Atlanta was ium, boiler room, and girls restroom will be paid off in February of 1995. Mr. Bellamy stressed that the relatively new and tinted thermopane windows recently installed at the high school in the present library and cafeteria will be reused and relocated in the new addition at the high school as well as the elementary school for a savings to he district. The new high school addition should be able to be constructed without

any tree removal. While the long range plans for the elementary school at Juliaetta will be completed in two stages, it will ultimately be designed for enough classrooms to have two classes per grade level from Kindergarten through 6th grade as well as a special education resource room, library, cafeteria and a music room/preschool/stage area. The long range plans would have a 7 classroom addition with 4 of these classrooms being constructed as a result of the October 1 Phase 1 election. When the long range plans are completed, it would likely house the intermediate school classrooms-4th, 5th, and 6th-leaving the existing building for primary age students The two sections of the school would be connected by a covered hallway/playground area along he west side of the new gymnasium.

The new library addition on to the high school will have a vaulted ceiling whereby additional light is admitted at the ceiling height area during the daytime. Behind the new addition, over the existing sloping roof, a heat pump area will be in-

The new high school addition will include a covered entry area for the entire school which will allow double entry doors (keeping the existing ones) for heat loss purposes during the winter. The main entrance to the new library addition will be from the covered entry area thus allowing evening useage of the library and technology room (computer lab.) while keeping the rest of the building secured.




