If your income does not exceed \$17,430 and you are a widow or widower, 65 years or older, disabled or a disabled veteran, you may qualiify for the exemption. This exemption must be applied for every year. You will want to bring the following: A copy of your Federal Income Tax Form 1040, if you filed one. Your Social Security Benefit Statement Form SSA-1099 stating the amount you received from Social Security. All medical expenses including prescriptions and medical insurance premiums. Any medical expenses you paid for and were not re-imbursed by medicare or insur-


