Circuit Breaker Tax Exemption Sign-ups In Vailey April 5

It is time to sign up for the Circuit Breaker, Senior Citizen Tax Exemption, reminds Latah County Assessor Steve Fiscus. The Deadline is Monday, April 17, 1995.

If your income does not exceed \$17,430 and you are a widow or widower, 65 years or older, disabled or a disabled veteran, you may qualify for the exemption. This exemption must be applied for every year.

You will want to bring the following: A copy of your Federal Income Tax Form 1040, if you filed one. Your Social Security Benefit Statement Form SSA-1099 stating the amount you received from Social Security. All medical expenses including prescriptions and medical insurance premiums. Any medical expenses you paid for and were not reimbursed by medicare or insurance.

Ryan Heier scored only three points in the game against the Deary Mustangs last Wednesday night in the District II, Class A4 basketball tournament at Lewiston, but it was three points that will be remembered for quite a while. Margaret (Millie) Corkill, a longtime area of the Leland and Kendrick area, will be honored on the occasion of her eightieth birthday anniversary at an open house reception at the Kendrick Grange Hall Saturday, March 4, between the hours of two and four o'clock.



Mrs. Corkill was born March 4, 1915 at Alexander, Manitoba, Canada, the daughter of Edwin and Margaret Brookshaw. In 1916 her family moved to Vanguard, Sask. where they homesteaded and then in 1922 moved to Neville, Sask. where they continued farming. She rode horseback about 2 1/2 miles daily to attend a rural school. In 1926 the family settled on a farm near Swift Current, Sask. where she continued her education at a small rural school.

She and Wilbur Corkill were married December 14, 1937 at Swift Current, and he moved his bride to his farm near Leland, Idaho in 1938. They farmed there until their retirement in 1975. Wilbur died in 1980 and Millie left the farm and moved to Kendrick, where she now makes her home, in 1984.

During the fifty-seven years she has lived in this area, Millie served as a community reporter for the Lewiston Morning Tribune and was a correspondent for the Kendrick Gazette for many years.

She is a member of the Kendrick United Methodist Church, Kendrick Grange No. 413, and the Hill and Valley Garden Club. She enjoys cake decorating, working in her flowers and doing handcraft.

She has a son Ed, Kendrick, and a daughter Pat Heimgartner, Clarkston; 6 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren. A son, Larry, died in 1965.

 SECTION 4: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication according to law.
