If you don't have high blood pressure, chances are that you know people who do. High levels of either systolic or diastolic pressure are potentially

dangerous. Blood pressure levels, especially systolic pressure, generally increase with age, so older older adults are more prone than the middle-aged to a condition called "isolated systolic hypertension."
