

School Supt. **Discusses May 16 Override Election** 

On Tuesday, May 16, tax payers will be asked to approve a \$220,000 override levy election for Joint District No. 283. Supt. of Schools Eldon Taylor said he has been asked questions from patrons and to help understand the levy, he has listed a few of the more frequently asked inquiries and answers them here. Question:

Will a \$220,000 override levy increase one's property tax, living within the boundaries of Kendrick chool District No. 283? Answer:

The honest answer to this is "yes" and "no". Yes, the overide levy itself will increase the override levy from \$190,000 (1994-95 tax year) to \$220,000 (1995-1996 tax year). No, your overall property tax total will go down because of the "property tax relief bill", H. B. 156, passed by the 1995 legislature. The total a \$62,400 savings to Disrict No. 283 patrons. 
