Kendrick Grange Takes Its Pulse

Six members of Kendrick Grange met together on June 20 and were forced by circumstances to begin consideration of the possible demise of their organization locally. For the second time in recent months the Grange lacked the quorum necessary to do business. Recent attendance has been spotty at best.

Despite the determination of a few to see the Grange continue as a social force in the community, hard facts suggest to that handful that, "the handwriting is on the wall." Like Moscow Grange, which earlier this year sold its Grange Hall and turned in its charter, Kendrick is sort on working members needed to carry out projects. Other Granges in Latah County face the same problem.

Grange Master Frank Jacobson is particularly concerned about the organization's future. He has long advocated that if the end is inevitable, the Grange, "should go out with a bang and not a whimper." One project, which he sees as possibly the Grange's last major order of business, is to try to save the Fraternal Temple Building for ongoing community use in the future. But he's discovering that determination and a dream are not enough. People, lots of them, members and non-members alike, are needed. And they are in short supply.

While not prepared to call for the immediate dissolution of Kendrick Grange, Jacobson will write to the membership and seek its response to the question, "Where do we want to go." In his mind, the few active members left are down to taking the pulse of their organization. Jacobson fears he day when he discovers that the pulse he's taking is his own. Readers familiar with the history of Kendrick Grange in this community may want to communicate to the Grange their regrets or, better yet, their ideas of how the institution can at least go out with a bang!

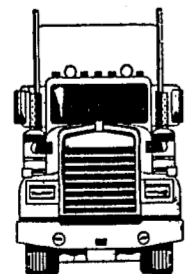

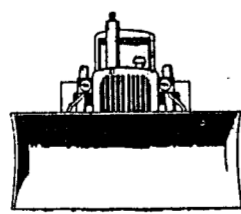
