Kendrick Approves Bond Issue

Kendrick took another step forward in its effort to improve the city's infrastructure Tuesday when voters went to the polls and approved the passage of a \$500,000 water seek re-election. There were 114 and sewer revenue bond. Of the 114 ballots cast, 96 voters said "Yes" and only 18 voted "No", for an 84.2 percent margin. A simple 51 percent margin was required to approve the issue.

"We're very happy with the vote," said Kendrick mayor Jerry Brown, speaking on behalf of both he and the council. Brown went on to thank the council for its many hours of hrad work in planning the project and seeing that the public was informed of its efforts to update and replace the water and sewer lines under main street. Brown also had high praise for the citizens of the community for the solid support and votes in the Tuesday election.
