### Kendrick Survives From her home in Council, Idaho, First Cut in Block **Grant Request**

The City of Kendrick's application Jim volunteered as as an interpeter for a \$476,050 Block Grant to improve the water and sewer lines on main street. The Idaho Economic Advisory Council last week released the names of 24 Idaho cities and counties who have been invited to compete for Idaho Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG) ject applications for more than \$13..1 million during a two-day meeting held last week in Boise. The requests were submitted by Idaho cities and counties for public facility and housing projects, sewer and water systems and fire and emergency medical stations. Approximately \$6 million is available.

Idaho receives approximately \$10 million in ICDBG funds each year from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The ho Department of Commerce. More projects and senior centers. The rest is awarded quarterly for economic development grants, or "as needed" for immenent threat situations. According to director James V. Hawkins, the program is customer-dri-

"Idaho's mayors and county commisioners—people who listen to their constituents and understand their community's needs—determine the priorities for funding," says Hawkins. "This year, there was a significant increase in the number of housing projects brought forward for consideration."

ICDBG funds are awarded through a two-part competitive review process. During November, pre-applications are submitted to the Idaho Economic Advisory Council for review. The finalists are invited to submit full applications which are reviewed again by the Idaho Department of Commerce staff and the council at a March meeting. The finalists are forwarded to Governor Phillip E. Batt who will award and announce the recipients in March of

The council also approved a \$250, 000 economic development grant request from the city of Pocatello for

The Idaho Economic Advisory sector advisory boad appointed by the governor. They provide guidance and approve plans, projects and programs initiated by the Idaho Department of Commerce.
