**RESOLUTION 96-147  
RESIDENTIAL  
ANTI-DISPLACEMENT AND  
RELOCATION ASSISTANCE  
PLAN**

Under Section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended:

The City of Kendrick will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable low/moderate-income dwelling units demolished or converted to a use other than as low/moderate-income housing in connection with an activity assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, as described in 24 CFR 570.606 (b) through (g).

All replacement housing will be provided within three years after the commencement of the demolition or conversion. Before entering into a contract committing the City to provide funds for an activity that will directly result in demolition or conversion, the City shall make public by notice in the Kendrick Gazette and shall submit the following in writing to the Idaho Department of Commerce.

1. A description of the proposed assisted activity;
2. The location on a map and number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be demolished or converted to other than low/moderate-income dwelling units as a direct result of the assisted activities;
3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion.
4. The location on a map and number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be provided as replacement dwelling units. If such data are not available at the time of the general submission, the City will identify the general location on an area map and the approximate number of dwelling units by size as soon as it is available;
5. The source of funding and a time schedule for the provision of the replacement dwelling units;
6. The basis for concluding that each replacement dwelling unit will remain a low/moderate-income dwelling unit for at least 10 years from the date of the initial occupancy;
6. Information demonstrating that any proposed replacement of dwelling units with smaller dwelling units (e. g., a 2-bedroom unit with two 1-bedroom units) is consistent with the housing needs of lower-income households in the jurisdiction.

The City shall be responsible for tracking the replacement housing and ensuring that is provided within the required period.

The City shall be responsible for ensuring requirements are met for notification and provision of relocation assistance, as described in 24 CFR 570.606 (b) through (g), to any lower-income person displaced by the demolition of any dwelling unit or conversion of a low/moderate income dwelling unit to another use in connection with an assisted activity.

Consistent with the goals and objectives of activities under the Act, the City of Kendrick will undertake the following steps to minimize the displacement of persons from their homes:

1. Coordinate code enforcement with rehabilitation and housing assistance programs.
2. Evaluate housing codes and rehabilitation standards in reinvestment areas to prevent their placing undue financial burden on long-established owners or tenants of multi-family buildings.
3. Stage rehabilitation of apartment units to allow tenants to remain during and after rehabilitation by working with empty units or buildings first.
4. Establish facilities to house persons who must be relocated temporarily.
5. Adopt public policies to identify and mitigate displacement resulting from intensive public investment in neighborhoods.
6. Adopt policies which provide reasonable protections for tenants faced with conversion to a condominium or cooperative.

**Howard T. Dammarell, 94,  
Formerly of Kendrick,  
Dies January 11**

Howard T. Dammarell, 94, a Kendrick area native, died Thursday, January 11, of causes related to age at the Shuksan Rehabilitation and Living Center in Bellingham, Wash.

He was born October 6, 1911, at Kendrick to Edgar and Nellie Middleton Dammarell.

After graduating from Kendrick High School, he attended the University of Idaho at Moscow and worked for Safeway Stores at Lewiston between 1935 and 1941.

During World War II he served as a tank platoon leader in France and Germany. He was awarded the Silver and Bronze stars, Purple Heart and French Croix de Guerre.

He married Aimee Lou Eyrault Oct. 18, 1947, at Walla Walla and they lived there while he worked for the U. S. Postal Service there. He retired as a supervisor in 1972 after 25 years and they moved to Sequim, Wash., in 1973.

He became a Christian in 1981 and in 1995 they moved to Meadow Greens retirement center at Lynden, Wash.

He was a member of Trinity Methodist Church at Sequim. He enjoyed gardening, camping and fishing.

Survivors include his wife, Aimee Lou Dammarell of Lynden; one son, Craig Dammarell of Ferndale, Wa.; three brothers, Robert Dammarell of Boise, Paul Dammarell of Kendrick and Quentin Dammarell of Santa Rosa, Calif.; and four grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by one son, Douglas; four brothers, John, Frank, Edgar and Keith; and two sisters, Ruth Asplund and Edith Wirt.

A memorial service will be held at 2 p. m. Saturday at Birch Bay Bible Community Church in Blaine, Wash., with the Rev. James Totzke officiating.

7. Adopt tax assessment policies such as deferred tax payment plans to reduce the impact of rapidly increasing assessments on lower-income owner-occupants or tenants in revitalized areas.

8. Establish counseling centers to provide homeowners and renters with information on the assistance available to help them remain in their neighborhood in the face of revitalization pressures.

The City of Kendrick shall include one or more of the above to implement the planning for minimizing the direct and indirect displacement of persons from their homes.

The City of Kendrick hereby certifies it has officially adopted said Residential Anti-Displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan. This plan shall become effective January 9, 1996.

**LEGAL NOTICES  
RESOLUTION 96-146  
FAIR HOUSING RESOLUTION**

LET IT BE KNOWN TO ALL PERSONS of the City of Kendrick that discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing, financing of housing or land to be used for construction of housing, or in the provision of brokerage services because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin is prohibited by Title VIII of the 1968 Civil Rights Act (Federal Fair Housing Law).

It is the policy of the City of Kendrick to implement programs to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex or national origin. The Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 expands coverage to include handicapped persons and families with children. Therefore, the City does hereby pass the following Resolution.

BE IT RESOLVED that within the available resources the City will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, handicap, or familial status to seek equity under federal and state laws by filing a complaint with the Idaho Human Rights Commission or the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Seattle Regional Office Compliance Division.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City shall publicize this Resolution and through this publicity shall cause owners of real estate, developers and builders to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Federal Fair Housing Law and amendments and any applicable state or local laws or ordinances.

SAID PROGRAM will at a minimum include, but not be limited to: (1) the printing and publicizing of this policy and other applicable fair housing information through local media and community contacts; (2) distribution of posters, flyers and any other means which will bring to the attention of those affected, the knowledge of their respective responsibilities and rights concern equal opportunity in housing.
