

The KHS boys' basketball team dropped two more contests this past week, taking an 85-26 pounding at the hands of Prairie last Friday at Cottonwood and then hosting the Culesac Wolves Saturday, who administered a 59-41 defeat to them.

Kendrick is now holding a 0-17 record on the season as the basketball year draws to a mercurial conclusion for the young Tigers.

The Prairie Pirates wasted no time jumping on the Tigers at Cottonwood. Prairie led 38-14 at the half then poured 47 more points in during the final two quarter. Kendrick

managed only a single free throw in the third quarter.

Parents Play an Important Role in Children's Dental Health

A lifetime of good dental health begins at home. "There are some important steps parents can take before their child's first visit to the dentist," says Dr. Peter Domoto,

chair of pediatric dentistry at the University of Washington School of Dentistry.

Baby/toddler tooth decay—the most serious childhood dental problem—can begin affecting children as early as 10 months of age. If left untreated, it can lead to pain and expensive dental treatment.

Also known as baby bottle tooth decay (BBTD), this condition is caused by the build-up of bacteria in the child's mouth coupled with exposing of baby teeth to liquids that contain sugar, including formula, breast milk and juice. A baby with a habit of falling asleep while breast feeding or drinking from a bottle filled with any sugary liquid is at risk of getting BBTD. Frequent snack on sweet or sticky foods can also cause decay.

"Baby Bottle Tooth Decay is a serious problem that is totally preventable," Domoto stresses.

Taking away bottles filled with juice or milk or stopping breast feeding as soon as your child falls asleep can help prevent BBTD. If your child requires a bottle at bedtime, provide one filled with water.

Or, instead of a bottle, try comforting your child with a pacifier or a favorite toy or blanket.

A child's teeth must be cleaned as soon as they erupt. Parents should use a damp cloth or a toothbrush and a tiny dab of fluoride tooth paste.

"This is a good habit to start early, as soon as the teeth come in," Domoto says, adding that teeth cleaning will remain a parent's responsibility into the pre-school years.

When cleaning teeth, parents should be sure to check their baby's mouth regularly for any chalky white or brown spots which could be the beginning of decay.

Consumers already know about beef's fine flavor but they need more information concerning beef's healthfulness, a University of Idaho animal scientist is telling cattle producers.

Susan Duckett says the beef industry is trying to inform consumers about the dietary value of beef.

"Beef compares favorably with other meats in regard to fat and cholesterol content," she emphasizes. "It is rich in protein, vitamins and minerals. Beef producers do not need to make any apologies regarding their product."

Duckett will be the featured luncheon speaker in Sandpoint on Feb. 3, during the Panhandle Beef School.

A vigorous marketing program should help the beef industry recover from its present state of depression, Duckett says.

"This looks like another lean year, and cattle producers are struggling to survive. They're trying to become more efficient and improve their marketing strategies."

Timely marketing is important, she says. "Feedlot producers should try to market their animals in March or April. If that's too early, it's a good idea to evaluate other marketing options."
