Dammarell, who lives on Little Bear Ridge, reported that he recorded 2.8 inches of rain and 41 inches of snow during the 31 days of the month. Bower reported that he recorded 1.59 inches of rain and 36 inches of snow at his Big Bear Ridge farm home.

Dammarell recorded rain 10 days in January, ranging from .01 to .07 inches. It snowed on 9 days of January's 31 days for the month. Twice there was snow fall of almost an inch in a 24-hour period.

On Tuesday at Frank's place the low was -2 (on the 30th) and a -4 on Wednesday, the 31st.
