### Heads Up for Traffic Flow Change at Town's West End

By Frank Jacobson

Because of sewer line installation being done by A&R Construction on Mill Street, all east and west bound traffic at the west end of Kendrick will now be dagger controlled one way only on Main Street during each working day.

At the end of each working day, however, east bound traffic will again use the back alley detour via Mill Street until the beginning of the next construction day, at which time both eastbound and westbound traffic will again share one lane of Main Street.

Because the Mill Street sewer installation was not part of the original plan, the ad hoc committee was not able to warn drivers of this change in advance. Changes, however, are inevitable in a project of the size of this being undertaken in Kendrick, Your patience and ability to adjust are important ingredients in the project and are much appreciated by the Idaho Transportation Department and the construction

firms involved. At the east end of town, out by the high school, work is progressing on widening the shoulders of the Big Bear link. Traffic in this construction area continues to be one way only as controlled by flaggers. Bruce Scherling, project manager for Poe Asphalt, warns drivers, particularly those carrying heavy loads, to slow down at transition points from paved to unpaved surfaces and back again in the construction areas. Be kind to your suspension and transmission, that's the message. An estimated date of completion for the Big Bear link was not available at Monday's 9 a. m. meeting in the firehall.

Meanwhile, Phase 1, estimated to take 20 to 23 construction days to complete, is pretty much on schedule.
