AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF JULIAETTA, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO THE CLEARWATER POWER COMPANY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION FACILITIES WITHIN THE CITY OF JULIAETTA; PROVIDING THAT THE TERM OF THE FRANCHISE SHALL BE TWENTY FIVE YEARS; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT UPON ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION ACCORDING TO LAW.

This Ordinance, which grants a franchise to the Clearwater Power Company for the construction, operation and maintenance of electric transmission facilities within the City of Juliaetta, was passed by the City Council and approved by the Mayor the 14th day of May, 1996.

Section 1 grants the franchise, Section 2 grants power to Grantee to construct, maintain, equip and operate transmission facilities. Section 3 sets a term for the franchise. Section 4 gives Grantee the right to excavate in the public areas. Section 5 gives Grantee the right to trim and remove vegetation when necessary. Section 6 states that Grantee shall comply with all valid rules related to their construction and maintenance. Section 7 states that Grantee shall not interfere with existing facilities. Section 8 states that Grantee's activities shall not preclude Grantor from doing needed construction/maintenance work on streets and roads. Section 9 states that any

needed moving of pipes and facilities shall be done by Grantee at Grantee's expense. Section 10 gives Grantee the right to make and enforce reasonable rules for the conduct of Grantee's business. Section 11 provides for Grantee right of ingress/egress upon its customers' properties. Section 12 requires Grantee to keep full and complete records of its lines and service connections. Section 13 states that any vacation of properties by Grantor shall not interfere with Grantee's rights provided in this Ordinance. Section 14 preserves Grantor's rights to control its own properties. Section 15 gives Grantor the right to remove Grantee's facilities in case of emergency. Section 16 states that this is a non-exclusive franchise. Section 17 provides for costs and fees. Section 18 sets terms for forfeiture of Grantee's rights. Section 19 provides conditions for expansion of Grantee's facilities. Section 20 provides for possible change of boundaries of Grantor. Section 21 provides for right of Grantee to assign this franchise. Section 22 provides for the effect of invalidity of any portion of this Ordinance. Section 23 provides for this Ordinance to be effective as a contract. Section 24 provides for indemnity of Grantor and Grantee. Section 25 provides for Grantee's right to abandon the franchise. Section 26 provides for acceptance of this franchise.
