Stress Effects from February Flooding May Occur in Victims

Six months have passed since the Presidential declaration of Idaho's Regions I and II as Federal Disaster areas. A lot of time has been spent by people in our communities repairing damage done to their property by the floods of February. As things return to normal, it is important to realize that there can be physical and emotional effects of the flooding as well. Many people experience long term stress effects from disasters. These are normal responses to abnormal events. Some of these reactions could include the following:

- * Fatigue,
- * Trouble concentrating or remembering,
- * Eating changes,
- * Increase in alcohol/drug consumption,
- * Anger, irritability,
- * Sleep disturbances,
- * Relationship conflicts.

Learning how to cope with the impact of a disaster is critical.

- Talking to others,

A federally funded program called Project Outreach has been set up in Regions I and II of Idaho. The goal of this program is to build up the well-being of communities in this area. Project Outreach workers do a variety of activities. They talk to individuals about their experiences since the flooding; they give presentations to groups; and they generally work to educate the public on long term effects of the flooding through various methods.

One project of the program is to compile a commemorative scrapbook about the effect of the flooding on Region II of Idaho. If you have pictures or a story to contribute to this scrapbook, you can write the story and send it to us, or we will pick it up. We can also record your story and we will put what you tell us in written story form.
