AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KENDRICK, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, TERMED 'ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BILL' APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING ALL NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF OCTOBER, 1996, AND ENDING ON THE THIRTIETH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1997; ALLOTING SAID APPROPRIATION FOR THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES SET FORTH IN THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR THIS ORDINANCE TO BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT UPON ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION.
