Ryan Heier Completes Navy Recruit Training

Navy Airman Recruit Ryan D. Heier, son Maury and Ellen Heier of Kendrick, recently completed U. S. Navy basic training at Recruit Training Command, Great Lakes, Illinois.

During the eight-week program, Heier completed a variety of training which included classroom study, practical hands-on instruction, and an emphasis on physical fitness. In particular, Heier learned naval customs, first air, fire fighting, water safety and survival, and a variety of safety skills required for working around ships and aircraft.

Heier and other recruits also received instruction on the Navy's core values—honor, courage and commitment—and what the words mean in guiding personal and professional conduct. Heier joins 55,000 men and women who will enter the Navy year from all over the country.

Men and women train together from the first day in the Navy just as they do aboard ships and at shore commands around the world. To reinforce the team concept, Heier and other recruits also were trained preventing sexual harassment and ensuring equal opportunity.

Even as the naval service gets smaller over the next few years, highly motivated young people like Heier are still finding an opportunity to improve their knowledge and education as they become part of the most highly technical navel force in history. This year alone the Navy will have more than 57,000 job openings and opportunities, most of which include guaranteed training. Ryan is a 1995 graduate of Kendrick High School.
