Harley Lloyd Porter, a former resident of Juliaetta who once guarded the infamous "Tokyo Rose", died Friday, December 6, 1996, of cancer at the hospital in Newport, Wash. othy Stanton Herres. While recoverhe was 70.

In 1944 he joined the Merchant Marine, but was only in it for a short time because he had a profound dislike for water. He then joined the U.S. Army to keep his feet on dry ground—and crossed the Pacific Ocean four times as part of the post-war Occupation Forces in Japan.

During the postwar treason trial of Tokyo Rose, an American of sons. 
