President Declares 13 Idaho Counties Major Disaster Areas

Jan. 4 — United States Senator Dirk Kepthorne notified Idaho Governor Phil Batt today that portions of Idaho have been declared federal Declaration at 4:15 p. m. Eastern time from Martha Braddock, Deputy Ridge, and Dave Morgan, who keeps Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

The Presidential Major Disastor Declaration means that federal resources can now be deployed to assist during the flooding emergency for 1996: and initial stages of recovery. An estimated 25,000 Idahoans have been January: isolated by numerous mudslids and washed-out roads.

"Governor Batt was quick to assess the damage and the need for federal assistance," Kempthorne said. "With the magnitude of this emergency, the Governor's swift action has allowed the President and his team to move expeditiously and open the way for all available federal resources to be used to deal with this emergency."

Kempthorne said FEMA has also set up a special hotline for flood victims. The toll--free number is 1-800-462-9029, and 1-800-462-7585 for the hearing impaired.

On Friday, Kempthorne received assurances from White House Chief of Staff Leon Panetta and Federal Emergency Management Agency Director James Lee Witt that the Governor's request for assistance would be expeditiously considered. Kempthorne also convened an emergency two-hour conference call Friday between officials in all of the counties affected by the disaster and Ron and Sonja Lohman were Joel top-level federal agency personnel July: Marshall of Lewiston, Shawni and in Washington.
