**Skin Patch for Athletes**

A skin patch to treat pain from sports injuries is being tested at the University of Washington Pain Clinical Research Center. Researchers are evaluating the effectiveness of the anti-inflammatory medication on adult volunteers with minor sports injuries (such as sprains, strains and bruises). It's hoped the topical application will provide direct relief from minor pain without the side effects associated with drugs taken orally, including stomach upset.

**UW DOCTORS HOPE EVEN MOMENTS OF CPR INSTRUCTION MAY HELP**

Do people need hours of training to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation? Or can they learn enough CPR from brief TV messages to save the life of someone in cardiac arrest? Doctors at the University of Washington hope to find out. If you suffer sudden cardiac arrest, one of the places you're most likely to survive is in a public setting in Seattle/King County, where many people are trained in CPR, and where the region's Medic I system offers rapid emergency response.

However, even in Seattle the survival rate is not as high as it could be, especially if cardiac arrest happens in the home, where family members may not know CPR. The procedure is essential to provide oxygen until emergency medical personnel arrive with a defibrillator to shock the wildly beating or arrested heart into a normal rhythm. People who receive immediate CPR from bystanders who witness the collapse are almost twice as likely to survive as those who don't receive treatment until emergency assistance arrives.

Researchers at the University of Washington will track survival rates from sudden cardiac arrest in the months before and after a series of short public service announcements that show the basics of CPR. The spots are airing on KING-TV, the local NBC affiliate. If survival rates rise, they will advocate expanded use of such messages.

"Even though Seattle is the CPR sophisticated city in the world, bystander CPR is performed less than half the time in cases of sudden cardiac arrest," said Dr. Mickey Eisenberg, director of the Emergency Medicine Service at University of Washington Medical Center. "And this is after many years of effort to train people."

The UW researchers want to find out whether people can absorb enough knowledge from two 30-second TV spots (narrated by local TV anchor, Jean Emerson) to enable them to perform CPR, said Eisenberg. The announcements are airing about 200 times over the course of four to five months, said Karla Halbakken, community relations director at KING-TV.

**New Food Stamp Work Requirements In Effect**

A new federal food stamp work requirement for able-bodied adults between 18 and 50 years of age went into effect Dec. 1, 1996, the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare reminded this week.

The new rule affects those adults between 18 and 50 who do not have dependent children and who are mentally and physically capable of working. To receive food stamps, adults in this category must meet one of the criteria:

- \* Work for 80 hours or more in a month;
- \* Participate in and comply with the requirements of a specified employment or training program for 20 hours or more per week.
- \* Participate in and comply with the requirements of a workfare program.

Adults participating in the food stamp program who do not meet the work requirement will be eligible for food stamps for only three months in a three year period. There are exemptions under the new work requirement. They include:

- Pregnant women; people caring for an incapacitated person; students enrolled at least half-time in any recognized school, training program or institute of higher education; applicants for supplement security income (SSI); participants in a drug or alcohol treatment program; people receiving unemployment benefit and recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits who are participating in the AFDC employment and training program.

**Idaho Pilot Refresher Course Set for Feb. 22-23**

Boise — A pilot refresher course with information on aviation safety and procedures will be held Feb. 22-23 in Boise, the Idaho Transportation Department's Division of Aeronautics announced. This Federal Aviation Administration-approved refresher clinic will renew unexpired Flight Instructor Certificates with all ratings.

The two-day clinic will be held at the National Interagency Fire Center, 3815 South Development, Boise, Idaho. Meetings times will be 7:15 a. m. to 6 p. m. each day. Breaks will be taken between each block of instruction, and a one-hour break for lunch will be given each day.

Several speakers, including corporate pilots and industry training and maintenance representatives, will be featured. The agenda will include discussions of air space, air traffic procedures, radio communication and aviation emergencies.

After successful completion of this clinic, each applicant will be able to renew his or her unexpired flight instructor certificate. Please be sure to bring your flight instructor certificate, airman medical certificate, and airman certificate with you so that a temporary flight instructor certificate can be issued.

The cost of the clinic is \$135 per person if paid in advance by Feb. 5.

**Harmful Dental Fillings?**

Are dental fillings harmful to kids' health? The University of Washington School of Dentistry is beginning one of the first studies aimed at determining whether mercury fillings are safe for children. The study, supported by the National Institute of Dental Research, will involve testing 500 children. "Because there has been a lack of clear and consistently demonstrated health effects, dental amalgams are assumed to be safe; however, this safety issue continues to be hotly debated," said Dr. Timothy DeRouen, UW chair of Dental Public Health Sciences and professor of biostatistics.

### Learning Together Works

When you were a kid, did one of your friends ever help you with a math problem? Or maybe it was your friends, leaning over you in a science class to say, "Hey, I don't get this. Do you?" You did get it, in fact, and you helped your friend to understand it, too. Indeed, those scenarios happened in virtually all of our school lives. Although it was informal, it was tutoring. It happens almost naturally with children in school—whether or not they have been instructed to tutor.

Now, in a booklet of compiled research called, "Tutoring: Strategies for Successful Learning," author Jennifer Fager describes what might be a typical scene in a classroom today with a purposeful tutoring program and a trained student tutor.

One child sighs in frustration as he attempts a challenging math problem. He can't seem to figure it out and looks to the group member next to him. She leans over to see if she can help. She takes him through the problem step by step until it "clicks" and he's off and running on his own. Once he seems to get it, she only checks occasionally to make sure he is doing it right.

Because research shows that an organized tutoring process can be a powerful learning tool for all involved, many educators across the Northwest are putting this tool to use. To help others who would like to know more, Fager pulled together a brief "Northwest Sampler" of tutoring programs from Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, and Washington to tell how they work.

The booklet profiles the three types of tutoring:

**Peer Tutoring:** The tutor and tutee are about the same age, grade, or academic status. Both students "speak" the same language, so in general they tend to feel comfortable with this process.

**Cross-Age Tutoring:** The tutor is an older student, the tutee the younger students. This arrangement has many of the benefits of peer tutoring, and it tends to confer status on the younger student who now has an older, higher-status friend.

**Parent/Volunteer Tutoring:** The tutor is an adult from outside the school. Because adult-student pairs are not as likely to become distract-
