**Idaho State Dept. of Ag. Responding to Flood**

Because of the immediacy of the situation, the Idaho State Department of Agriculture, at the direction of Director Takasugi, is working cooperatively with other state and federal agencies to assess needs for livestock owners and their livestock due to the recent flooding in Idaho.

These needs, for both dairy and beef producers, may include hay and livestock feed lost in the flooding, disposal of dead animals, medical care of animals affected by prolonged immersion in flood water, lack of clean, uncontaminated drinking water, and dry calving areas.

The ISDA is working in concert with the Cooperative Extension Service, USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA), USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), Idaho Cattle Association, and the Idaho Dairymen's Association to identify programs available to livestock owners that would help them recover from their losses.

If citizens have suffered losses to livestock or livestock feed they should contact their county disaster or emergency team. This team is made up of county agents, USDA-FSA, USDA-NRCS, and the Rural Development Group. They should also contact the FEMA office a 1-800-462-9029. The ISDA can be reached at 208/332-8500.

"I would ask Idaho agriculture organizations to look at developing assistance projects for fellow cattlemen and dairymen for hay and feed, much like their drought assistance programs to other states. Times like these are what brings out the best in Idaho people. Neighbor helping neighbor and strong Idaho people pulling through on their own," said Director Takasugi.

**Letters to the Editor . . .**

The Idaho Assistive Technology Project assists older persons and individuals with disabilities in Idaho in acquiring the assistive technology they need to live more independent and productive lives. Assistive technology refers to any device or service that enables people with disabilities to move, communicate, learn, work, or perform everyday living activities. Examples of assistive technology can be as simple as adaptive eating utensils, or as com-

plex as a power wheelchair or computer.

The project has developed a database of used equipment. The "Assistive Technology Recycling Service" provides individuals with a method for locating needed, used equipment and provides a system for advertising equipment to be sold or loaned. Examples of equipment that could be listed include: van with lift, wheelchair, adaptive toys, telephone amplifier, chin switch, etc.

There are five regional assistive technology resource centers around the state. These centers provide services which include technology-related assessments and evaluations, training to consumers, family members, and service providers.

The Idaho Assistive Technology Project, in cooperation with First Security Bank and the Idaho Community Foundation, offers low interest loans for persons with disabilities to purchase assistive technology.

Through our 800 number we can provide you with information about assistive technology and refer you to the regional center closest to your home. Persons with disabilities, their family and friends, and service providers can be assisted by our project to meet needs and create independence. We look forward to talking with you!

### Don't Give Kids Cigarette Premiums, Expert Says

Don't give kids those cute T-Shirts, hats and other "premiums" that cigarette companies hand out free: It just might encourage them to take up the habit, says a researcher at Stanford University Medical Center.

Ellen Feighery, a research associate at the Stanford Center for Research in Disease Prevention, says a recent study by her group found that seventh graders were more than twice as likely to experiment with cigarettes if they owned one of the promotional items that tobacco companies give out as premium gifts or advertising vehicles.

"We're not saying that the T-shirts and gifts actually prompted the kids to take up cigarettes," Feighery explains. "What the research did show is that kids who owned these items were 2.2 times more likely to say they had experimented with cigarettes."

Feighery says it's important for older family members and friends to help kids avoid associating cigarettes with glamor, fun or friendship, "and it just makes sense not to present them with a gift that endorses a substance that has proved to be so harmful to their health."

"It's a good idea to deglamorize the advertising to make kids savvy customers," she says. "Help them separate the buzz from the reality. For example, those attractive models with cigarettes in their mouths probably have yellow teeth and bad breath."

### Door-to-Door Service Available from Gritman Medical Center
