> The Arrow to Moscow line is the most direct rail line between Lewiston and Spokane. Currently it takes an east bound railcar 3 to 4 days to get from Lewiston to Spokane via the down river route and Pasco. Those downriver rail lines run along the Snake River for significant portions of their length. When the drawdown occured in 1993 those tracks and the banks they run on were damaged and down river rail traffic ceased. The damage occured because the pressure of the slack water is necessary to stabilize the rail dikes. When future drawdowns occur the same damage to the rail lines will happen with every drawdown. With no barge traffic or down river rail transportation that means that every grain, wood and manufactured product that goes to outside ports through the Lewiston-Clarktson area will either set there or have to be shipped out by truck via Highway 95, 195, or 12 unless the Arrow to Moscow line is available and active. If the rail line is torn up, the Port of Lewiston and the Idaho Department of Transportation are interested in acquiring the current rightof-way. However, according to Ron Kerr, senior transportation planner, the state is not interested in the portions within Juliaetta and Kendrick

Finally, even though it doesn't look it the rail line is in pretty good shape. Only about a mile of the 38mile length needs to be repaired. In the two years before Burlington Northern stopped using the line in 1984, they undertook a major track renovation and repair of the Arrow to Moscow line. Ties and rails were replaced and the bridges were redecked. According to one rail consultant the necessary repairs to the line wouldn't be as onerous, financially or physically, as many of
