A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF JULIAETTA, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF IDAHO, PROVIDING FOR A CHANGE IN CITY WATER RATES, PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF ANY PROVISION INCONSISTENT WITH THIS RESOLUTION, PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THIS RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 217 authorizes the Council to change water rates by Resolution; and WHEREAS, the Council finds it necessary to adjust water rates to adequately and fairly reflect expenses of the system.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JULIAETTA AS FOLLOWS:
SECTION 1.0 WATER RATES: The following monthly rates are hereby established for water service within the City:

Minimum water rates: \$22.00 (for first 6,000 Gal used) month
Rate per additional 1,000 Gal (6,000 to 12,000 Gal.)

\$1.50/1,000 Gal.
Rate per additional 1,000 Gal 12,000 to 300,000 Gal.)

\$2.50/1,000 Gal.
Rate per additional 1,000 (Over 300,000 Gal.)

\$4.00/1,000 Gal.
SECTION 2.0 REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS: Any provision of any prior ordinance or re-

solution which is inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3.0 This Resolution shall be effective from and after May 31, 1997.


