PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, according to law, and the requisite action of the Board of Trustees of Kendrick Joint School District No. 283, Latah, Nez Perce and Clearwater Counties, State of Idaho, that a special supplemental levy election has been called and will be held in Kendrick Joint School District No. 283, Latah, Nez Perce and Clearwater Counties, State of Idaho, on Tuesday, May 20, 1997, between the hours of 12:00 noon and 8:00 p. m. of such day, at the various polling places hereinafter designated, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said District, for the vote and determination.

QUESTION: "Shall the Board of Trustees of Kendrick Joint School District No. 283, Latah, Nez Perce and Clearwater Counties, State of Idaho, be authorized and empowered to levy a supplemental levy as provided in Idaho Code 33-802 in excess of the amount otherwise permitted by law, in the amount of \$220,000.00, Two Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars, for the 1997-98 fiscal year for the purpose of paying all lawful expenses of maintaining and operating the schools?"

Each qualified elector of said District as defined by Idaho Code Section 33-405, as amended, shall vote on said question by secret and separate ballot, whereon shall be printed the question above submitted, and the ballot, whereon shall also, in addition to the above question, contain the following:

For Supplemental Levy of \$220,000.00 for the 1997-98 fiscal year? YES []

For Supplemental Levy of \$220,000.00 for the 1997-98 fiscal year? NO []

and such voter shall indicate his approval or disapproval of the question submitted by marking an "X" opposite the word, "For Supplemental Levy of \$220,000.00 for the 1997-98 fiscal year Yes", "For Supplemental Levy of \$220,000.00 for the 1997-98 fiscal year No", on the ballot which expresses his choice.

The polls for reception of the ballots cast on said election are to be opened at the hour of 12:00 noon and will remain open until the hour of 8:00 P. M. of said date; when they will be closed.

Said School District shall for the purpose of said election be divided into four (4) polling places within the boundaries of Kendrick Joint School District No. 283 and the polling places of the respective precincts shall be as follows

Latah County—Precinct No. 23—(Juliaetta & a portion of American Ridge and a portion of Fix Ridge)

Juliaetta Elementary School Juliaetta, Idaho

Latah County—Precinct No. 24—Kendrick & portion of American, Cedar, Big Bear, & Little Bear Ridges)

Precinct No. 25—(Linden) Kendrick High School Kendrick, Idaho

Nez Perce County—Precinct No. 34 (Leland, Cameron, & Southwick)

Cameron Lutheran Church Cameron, Idaho

Clearwater County—Precinct No. 8—(Teakean) Albert Lawrence Home Southwick, Idaho

QUALIFICATIONS OF VOTERS Any person voting, or offering, to vote, in the Supplemental Levy Election must be, at the election:

- 1. Eighteen (18) years of age or older.
2. Citizen of the United States.
3. Resident of Kendrick Joint School District No. 283, Latah, Nez Perce, and Clearwater Counties, State of Idaho, at least thirty (30) days next preceding day of election.
4. Registered voter of the State of Idaho.

In addition to the foregoing qualifications, a school elector shall have executed, in writing and immediately before voting, a form of elector's oath attesting that he or she possesses the qualifications of a school elector in the records and returns of the board of election.

Absentee voting shall be permitted as provided by Section 33-406, as amended, Idaho Code. Any qualified Trustee zone elector who expects to absent from the District on the day of election or who will be unable, because of physical disability or blindness, to go to the polling place may make written application to the Clerk of the District for a ballot of the kind to be voted on at election, which application shall contain the name of the elector and the elector's

present address. The application for an absent elector's ballot shall be filed with the clerk not later than one (1) hour prior to the opening of the polls. The absentee ballot must be received by the clerk, not later than 8:00 P. M. on the day of the election, before such ballot may be counted.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN: That, the annual school election of Kendrick Joint School District No. 283, Latah, Nez Perce, and Clearwater Counties, State of Idaho, will be held on May 20, 1997, and the polls of said election will be open between the hours of 12:00 noon and 8:00 P. M., on said day.

Only those qualified electors residing in Trustee Zone No. 5 may vote for a Zone No. 5 candidate. The purpose of said election shall be to elect one trustee to serve for a period of three years from the date of the election who resides within Trustee Zone No. 5.

Trustee Zone No. 5 is more specifically described as follows:

TRUSTEE ZONE NO. 5—Cameron—Leland—Southwick

Nominations of candidates must be filed with the Clerk of the Election not later than 5:00 P. M. on the fifth Friday (Friday, April 18, 1997), preceding the day of election of Trustees. As provided by Idaho Code, Section 33-502A, no write-in vote shall be counted unless a declaration of intent has been filed with the District Clerk indicating that the person desires the office and is legally qualified to assume the duties of school trustee, if elected. The declaration of intent shall be filed not later than five (5) days before the day of the election.

Polling place for Trustee Zone No. 5 shall be the Cameron Lutheran Church, Cameron, Idaho and the Albert Lawrence home at Southwick, Idaho.

Said election shall be by secret and separate ballot.

Absentee voting shall be permitted as provided by Idaho Code, Section 33-406, as amended. Any qualified trustee zone elector who expects to be absent from the District on the day of election or who will be unable, because of physical disability or blindness, to go to the polling place may make written application to the Clerk of the District for a ballot of the kind to be voted on at election, which application shall contain the name of the elector and the elector's present address.

As provided by Idaho Code, Section 33-406, as amended, application for an absentee elector's ballot must be received by the clerk, not later than 8:00 P. M. on the day of the election, before such ballot may be counted.
