School District Votes May 20 on Override, Trustee

Next Tuesday voters in Kendrick Jt. School District No. 283 will go to the polls to vote on a \$220,000 override levy. In an effort to explain how important this issue is to the schools, Supt. Eldon Taylor has taken two of the most frequently asked questions and explains them here. Question?

How much will this \$220,000 maintenance and operation override raise our property taxes?

Answer: The M&O override levy will not raise your taxes because the board of trustees froze the override at the \$220,000 level. This will be the third year at this \$220,000 level and will cover such items as school utilities building maintenance, books, sup-

Why are some districts able to reduce overrides, others raise them, and some freeze them such as ours. Answer:

Each district is unique in Idaho on what their local needs are: Genesee is raising its levy from this year's \$207,000 because of some safety maintenance repairs to the school building. Whitepine is raising its because of inflation costs of supplies. Potlatch is lowering its levy because this year's \$325,000 included some one-time maintenance projects that needed to be completed. Moscow as well as Kendrick froze their levy the same as last year's. Lewiston raised its revenue from this year's \$8,311,544 because as a charter school district, they set a tax levy rate instead of a fixed dollar amount like all other districts, ex-

cept Boise, are required to do. Here the reader can see how Jt. School District 283 levy rate compares with other nearby districts.
