## January 1998 -- Not Much Rain, Not Much Snow, Not Much Cold

January of 1998 might best be described as a moderate month--little rain not much cold and not many days of cold weather, according to figures handed in this week by Frank Damarell, who records the elements from his ranch on the southwest section of Big Bear Ridge.

Frank reported that 2.2 inches of rain was recorded in the 31-day period and snow fell five days that month and totaled 9 inches.

## KHS Tigers Post Two Wins, Two Losses In League Action

In recent basketball action, the Kendrick Tigers posted 2 wins and two losses. The Tigers won over Nezperce and Culesac, but dropped games to Highland and Troy.

All the games were Whitepine League contests.

Friday, Jan. 23 the Tigers took 50-27 defeated at the hands of the tough Troy Trojans at Kendrick. Kendrick bounced back the next night and defeated the visiting Nezperce Indians 57-43 for their second win of the season. Tony Howerton paced the Kendrick win with 14 points and Tim Silflow added 12. Matt Tefft and Bryan Carter had 10 points each in the balanced Tiger attack.

Last Thursday the Highland Huskies came to Kendrick and went home with a 67-39 win over the less than 14 points for the Tigers, with Carter scoring 12.

Friday night the Tigers racked up victory number three on their way to a 67-39 win over the hapless Culesac Wolves.

Kendrick jumped out fast, leading 34-17 at the half, and were never in trouble.

Kendrick got a 14 point effort from Nate Eichner and 12 points each from Bryan Carter and Tim Silflow.

## Zzzzz... How to Get A Good Night's Sleep

Did you sleep well last night? Or did you wake up feeling fatigued and sluggish--perhaps even wondering if you really slept at all? Getting a good night's sleep requires more than crawling to bed and closing your eyes. Understanding your sleep behavior and preparing for a sound slumber can help make sure every night is a good night for sleeping.

"Sleep is a behavior and, like all behaviors, it varies greatly among people," explains Dr. Carol Landis, sleep researcher and associate professor in biobehavioral nursing and health systems at the University of Washington School of Nursing. "The greatest differences occur in the timing of sleep and the amount of sleep--the factors which are most important in determining whether you will wake up feeling rested."

Research has found that people sleep better at different times during their daily cycle. For example, some people function better if they go to sleep early and rise early, while others feel more rested if they stay up late and sleep in.

"Many people don't pay attention to the timing of their sleep," Landis notes. "Yet delaying or altering the time you go to sleep can have a major impact on how you feel when you wake up."
