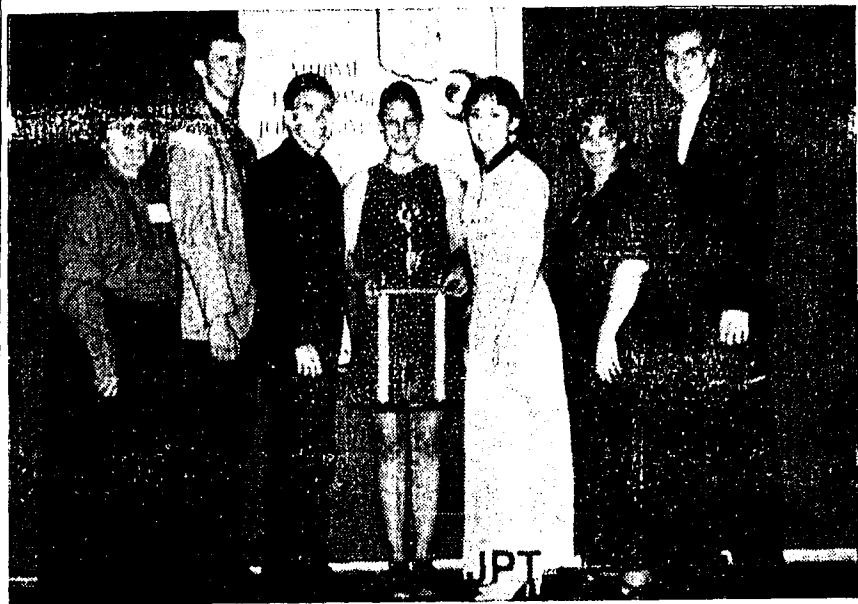

## Local 4-H Soil Judging Teams Did Well In National Competition in Oklahoma City



The Latah County 4-H Soil teams have returned home after participating in the 47th National Land and Range Judging Contest in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The group competed in the nation's top land and homesite judging event at a site near Oklahoma City. The Express Limousine Ranch near Yukon (home of Garth Brooks) was this year's site for a fantastic contest on a beautiful day.

Members of the Latah County Soil teams tested their individual and team skills against other land judging teams from approximately 35

states across the nation by evaluating land characteristics such as topsoil, subsoil slope and plant life. They were also required to recommend treatment to improve the land's capability for certain purposes such as producing crops, raising cattle or building homes. There were 99 FFA teams and 30 4-H teams participating in this year's contest. At each site there were four soil trenches for groups to evaluate. After the land judging competition was completed, 4-H'ers judged the same sites for homesite evaluation. The contest took over four hours to complete.

At the awards banquet over 1100 participants and coaches learned the results of the contest. Individuals from Latah County participating were: Jennifer Colwell, Josh Czernowski, Aletha Falen, Tim Knox, Ben Marek and Katy Roberts. The homesite teams placed 7th and 8th overall and in land judging they placed 18th and 20th overall. Each 4-H'er accomplished a personal goal for the contest as each scored high in at least one evaluation event or at one site. The two teams scored the same in the homesite competition and won the Western Region Homesite trophy. Following the presentation of awards, contest chairman Russell Pierson urged teens and adults alike to commit themselves to a better environment for future generations. "I am asking you to apply these land judging skills in ways that will help ensure this country remains 'America the Beautiful,'" said Pierson.

The trip was made possible by a lot of hard work, fund-raising, and generous support from local donors such as the 4-H Leader's Council, Moscow Rotary Club, Moscow Central Lions Club, Palouse Sunrise's Kiwanis Club, Genesee Union Warehouse, Genesee Rim Riders, Potlatch Corporation and many other groups and individuals.

These 4-H'ers spent many hours practicing before they left for Oklahoma City and two days at practice pits upon arrival. After the contest was completed, the 4-H'ers had time to see some of the local points of interest. They visited the Cowboy Hall of Fame and Western Heritage Museum, Oklahoma Zoo, Kirkpatrick Omniplex Science Museum, the Remington Park horse races, Oklahoma State cutting championships, and several shopping sprees at Shepherds. One evening everyone enjoyed a steak dinner at the Cimarron Steak House on Meridian. Great job to all those that helped make this experience possible.

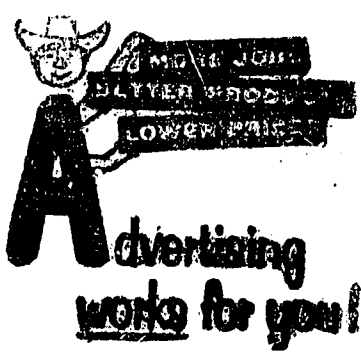
